SIGHT WORDS

Each week the students will be learning five sight words. These words are high frequency words which will help your child in their reading success. We will be focusing on one new word each day, and we will be reciting them in the same order every time. This helps students memorize the pattern as well as the word itself. Students will eventually be able to recognize all the words. It is also beneficial if they are reviewed at home. Each Friday, five words will be sent home which we have been or will be working on.
